From the Pastor's Pen

Last Sunday (Dec 1st) the Epistle reading was from 1 Thessalonians 3. Verses 9-10 read, "For what thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God, as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith?"

Have you ever waited with bated breath for someone's arrival? Maybe a child was coming home from college or a military deployment. Maybe your best friend in college that you haven't seen in years. Or your spouse who has been away on a trip taking care of the kids on the other side of the country. But now they are coming. They'll be here any moment. You're excited. Joy wells up in your heart.

When Paul wrote the above words to the Christians in Thessalonica, he was writing to a congregation he had met only briefly. We read in Acts 17 about his short-term ministry there. He preached, got persecuted, and was sent away for his safety. Although it was a brief visit, God's Word did a marvelous work. People came to faith and a church was started.

While Paul could have boasted about what great results came from his short visit, he does not. He gives thanks to God: "Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. <u>We give thanks to God always for all of you</u>..." (1 Thess 1:1-2a). Paul thanked God.

While there is much excitement in our world at this time of the year as Christmas approaches, very little of it has anything to do with the arrival of the Lord Jesus. Let's let Paul's words to the Thessalonians be a guide for us this time of year: "How can we thank God enough?"

The truth is... we can't. Not really, at least. How can we truly thank God enough for sending us a Savior? Who was born into our flesh to take upon himself our sins? Who died for us to bring us the joy of sins forgiven? For the gift of eternal life? Can we really thank God enough for all this?

While we cannot really give God enough thanks for all he's done, we can take some time to stop, and give him thanks for the gift of his Son, who's coming is, after all, the reason for the season. And I know of a good place to do that...

The word Advent means "coming". During Advent, we prepare for the coming of the One who was born that first Christmas in a stable. We prepare for the One who saved us from sin, death and the power of the devil: our Lord Jesus Christ! What a wonderful and exciting time of preparation!

Repenting of "Yours" and "Mine"

Retailers have had their Christmas displays up since before Reformation Sunday. The kids have made their list and checked it twice, or three times or more. It won't be long before the tree will start shedding its needles, the stockings emptied, the gifts unwrapped, toys broken, and the too small or out of style clothes returned. Before we know it, the annual celebration of Christmas will be over.

But for the children of God, we know that the gift of Christmas doesn't ever end. Week in and week out, the Lord continues to shower His gifts on us. Every time the Lord gathers us to His house, and we are led to kneel at His table, the gift of forgiveness is repeatedly granted to us. It is nothing we deserve. It comes to us freely!

The fourth stanza of the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us Lord for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) highlights both this gift and our response.

Teach us, O Lord, true thankfulness divine, that gives as Christ gave, never counting cost

To learn thankfulness is necessary. The parents of young children are well-versed in the fact that they must teach their children thankfulness. It does not come naturally. The spiritual genetics inherited from our parents allow us to think that the world revolves around us. When we receive something, there is an inward desire to think that we in some way deserve it.

But there is no way that we deserve anything we get from our Lord. We need that ongoing lesson from God Himself. Thankfulness toward God is worked in us by the Holy Spirit. God's Word works this thanksgiving in us. We need this weekly reminder that Jesus didn't consider "equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself" for us, to the point of death on a cross (Phil. 2:6). He didn't bat an eye. He paid the price! Our life of stewardship is one of daily and weekly thanksgiving inspired by the Lord Himself.

That knows no barrier of "yours" and "mine," assured that only what's withheld is lost.

Because Jesus gave us everything and more, there can be no ownership. The child at Christmas is quick to claim that the newly gifted toy is "mine!" But as Psalm 24:1 asserts, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein." There isn't anything in creation that is ours. When we cling to and claim ownership of anything in creation, we are losing out on the continual gifts with which the Lord desires to shower upon us. Closed hands cannot receive anything new. We cling to the old and dead and miss the new thing that the Lord desires to do in and for us.

We are led to repent of the "yours" and "mine" and remove the lie that we have any ownership. In this we have the promise that God will continue to give to us. Not just at Christmas, but every Sunday at the altar in the Lord's house.

Council Briefs November 2024

Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion.

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Council meeting Minutes for October were reviewed, corrected, and accepted by council.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Year to Date, Offerings and Tithes are short of the Planned budget by \$6,121.96. October Offerings and Tithes were short of the plan by \$4,958.74. All major projects are excluded from these numbers.

The Budget Committee presented a balanced budget to the Council and the council accepted it. We are forecasting a significant reduction in giving for 2025 and there is no forecast for an increase in the Preschool revenues in 2025 therefore, the proposed 2025 budget is smaller than the 2024 budget.

In order to reach a balanced budget proposal for 2025, each Redeemer department budget was reduced. In addition, there were two significant cuts proposed by the Budget Committee. First, Pastor Watts' compensation package was reduced with the understanding that if there is a surplus at the close of 2025, the surplus will be paid to Pastor, up to the amount his compensation was reduced, in January 2026. The second significant cut was reducing the amount of donations Redeemer makes to the District.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> For the month of October, Pastor Watt preached 3 out of 4 Sundays, conducted one service at Woodway Senior Living, and taught one Young Adult Bible Study in his home. Pastor also made 4 pastoral visits, and 2 shut in visits. The Young Adult Bible Study was cancelled due to scheduling conflicts of the Young Adults. The average worship attendance in October was 56.

<u>Education Committee Report</u>: All is going well with the preschool. Heidi and Payton have been cleaning the preschool rooms a bit every day after class. They have been asked to keep track of their hours so they may be paid accordingly.

The Sunday School will be doing a simple Christmas program. Dee is working with the students on three songs for the program.

<u>Elders Report</u>: The Elder Board is continuing to work on a donation schedule for members wanting to hold events at Redeemer. There will also be guidance on the types of events that would be allowed. The Elders are continuing to work on a photo member directory for the congregation.

<u>Stewardship Report</u>: The Advent By Candlelight Brunch will be after the December 1st service this year. There will be a special program, an in-gathering for the Redeemer Kitchen and Pre-school,

and a Christmas Carol singalong. The Brunch items will be provided but the congregation members have been asked to contribute to a special dessert buffet.

<u>Property Report</u>: The project to remove some trees behind the education wing and to prune some bushes near the road, has begun. All expenses are being paid by a generous donor and are not reflected in the proposed 2025 budget. Rocks will also be delivered for a flower bed in front of the church.

<u>Evangelism Report:</u> Ross Abbe reported that upcoming Evangelism meetings will be focused on family and our faith.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: Two cleaning companies have bid on the cleaning of the church. Council was able to review one bid that was fully detailed and the other wasn't available at the meeting. In order to be sure we are comparing "apples to apples," no decision was made. For now, we continue to rely on member volunteers to help with basic cleaning tasks.

<u>New Business</u>: A representative from the NW District of Education visited the church and preschool. The representative thought that our facility would pass inspection to provide pre-school and daycare before and/ or after care. This could be an option for additional revenue if our preschool numbers continue to decline in the future.

A portable speaker system and microphone for the Fellowship area was discussed as a useful tool for events like Advent by Candlelight etc... This will be seriously researched by council.

Pastor gave a closing prayer.
